

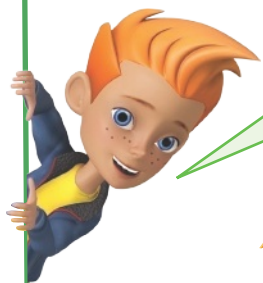

How can she count to find how many in all?

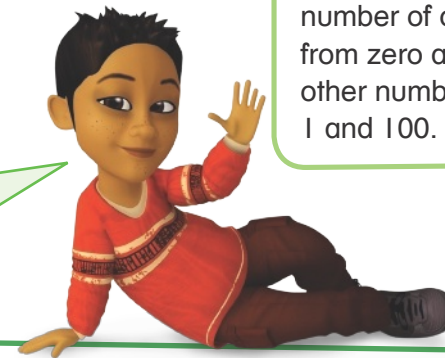


I can count on from 100.



101, 102, 103, 104



I will count by 1s with so few cars. Amy has 104 cars.

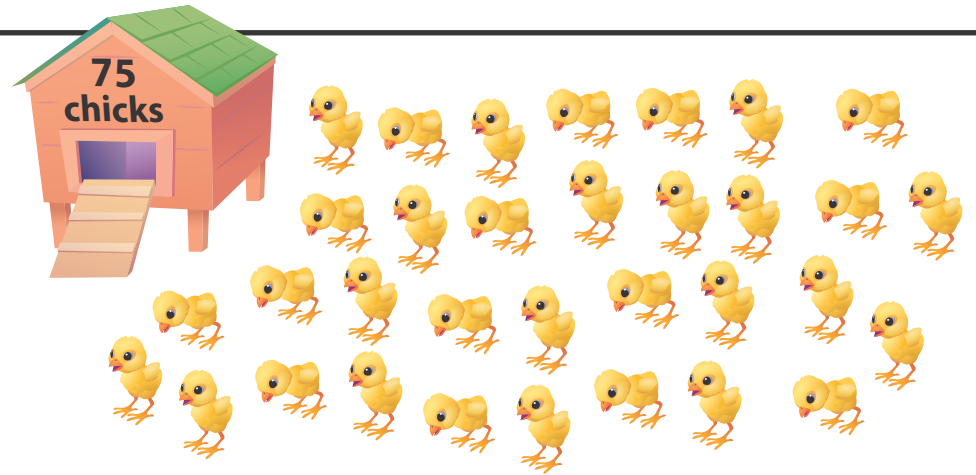
